Matters arising

FLS Ranger job advert: we have received 20 applications, FLS will interview all candidates and keep a reserve list if there are other good ones. Robbie will then seek agreement to the jointly funded post.

Community Action Plan

New website (https://orchyandawe.co.uk/), hopeful for funding to get training to keep it updated.

Orchy and Awe Trust will be launched on Friday, 23 May 2025 and it will become a limited company by guarantee with charity status at this point.

Membership is open to anyone in the area, include an offer of youth membership and an associate member for people committed to the area but who do not live here.

Grant applications from GreenPower

Two applications were received, both from St. Conan's Kirk. It was agreed that we would be happy to support one project, because of the overall annual funding budget, and the CC would respond inviting them to choose which project they would like to pursue.

Police report

Changing and trying to give us more specifics, as it has been raised by the CC and community that we would like more information.

There is no legal requirement to report hitting a stag to Police, but where the animal is injured in the road or dead and causing a hazard to drivers, people can phone using 999 and they will send someone out, if available, to help ensure no other vehicles collide with it. Equally, if the car that hit the animal is immobilised and in a hazardous location whilst awaiting recovery, we would come and assist to ensure the safety of those involved.

Council Report

Visitor Levy: consultation finished, officers have decided that external support is going to analyse the responses and looking at examples of business and the impact that will have on businesses and the report will come back to the council. No expectation that this will come back before the summer. It was asked whether they are looking for business to volunteer – waiting to hear.

Community Council changes: not many changes proposed, a few minor boundary changes, none affect us but open to us to feed into if we want to make changes, Cllr Green will check funding as we think it might have been reduced.

Council budgets: not looking good, £10 millions of savings having to be made over the next few years, don't know what the impact will be on council tax. No details at this stage but Cllr Green will feedback to us when he knows.

Raised that there is one councillor that we have never seen and that they have never attended CC meetings. Can the CC write to the councillors to ask them to attend the meeting – "appreciate their perspectives on a number of issues"?

Water level meeting: the council representative did not know what was happening and was not informed, she had little of use to say about A&B role in Loch Awe, SEPA issue the CAR licenses and no one monitors, could Cllr Green go back to the relevant department – SEPA saying they have no responsibility and it's the council's jobs and we need someone on the council who is familiar with the issues and what the council can and cannot do – it's the monitoring and regulation of the CAR license that will dictate the levels. How can we help the council? Cllr Green explained legislation did not foresee somewhere like Loch Awe – the council won't have the resources to monitor or support flood alleviation. The council could possibly support with the data, calibrating monitoring devices – independent measuring probably couldn't do that.
